**RE: UNEQUIVOCAL STATEMENTS BY PARENTS OF THE CHIBOK GIRLS SCHOOLING
IN AMERICA UNDER THE EDUCATION MUST CONTINUE INITIATIVE (EMCI) ON
THEIR GUARDIANSHIP**

We are solicitors to the parent/guardians of the Chibok girls currently schooling in America under the EMCI and have their firm instructions to forward copies of their attached letters whose original copies had been forwarded to you previously.

It is our clients' instructions that for the purpose of emphasis and clarity your attention should once again be drawn to the content of their letter under reference wherein they expressed their confidence and trust in the guardianship of Emmanuel Ogebe and Paul Gadzama through whose humanitarian efforts, compassion and concern they girls were sponsored to the US in the first place.

It is our client's further instructions that on no account should their children be handed over to any American family or institution or any persons whatsoever other than the said Mr. Ogebe and Mr. Gadzama. The mentoring of their daughters to ensure they do not morally derail or lose their cultural values which is a key component of their program for which EMCI is responsible.

Our clients note with dismay the undue politicization of these laudable and humble humanitarian efforts by patriots who came to their aid at the time of crisis more especially when the government of Nigeria failed, refused and neglected to assist their daughters.

Our clients note also that the embassy of Nigeria was particularly harsh towards the Chibok parents and spent millions of dollars maligning them during the government's image laundry effort to counter their legitimate campaign for the rescue of their daughters.
